## INTRODUCTION

The Collect of this week prays that we may put on an armor. Who wears armor? Soldiers. Whose soldiers are we? Christ's. Then whose armor shall we wear? Christ's. What is it called? The Armor of Light.

- I. PREPARATION FOR THE ARMOR.
- 1. Something to be cast off. Armor should not be put over a diseased body. Disease must be cured, and a weak body must be strengthened. When night is past we throw off our bed clothes; the soldier throws off his blanket. What is this season? Advent—when we think of Christ "coming to" us. Night is passing, day is coming. Souls must be cleansed, healed, restored and strengthened by Christ. Sin must be cast away. Darkness and night stand for sin and evil. This time calls us to put off sins. "Cast off the works of darkness."

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# **READ: Ephesians 6:10-19**

II.	THE DEFENSIVE PARTS OF THE ARMOR.
1.	Breastplate of (for passive defense) It protects the heart, the seat of life and conscience. Sin is like holes in the breastplate.
2.	Helmet of (for passive defense) This covers the head. We must trust in Christ's redemption and in His promises. The devil tempts us with evil thoughts and with doubts of our salvation.
3.	Shield of (for active defense) Really Christ is our shield (Gen 15:1), but faith uses Him. So: Christ's <u>Righteousness</u> is our Defense. Christ's <u>Salvation</u> is our Defense. Christ <u>Himself</u> is our Defense.  To put on the Armor of Light is to put on the Lord Jesus Christ as the Epistle tells us.
III.	THE "SERVICE" PARTS OF THE ARMOR.
1.	Belt of We must be braced up, ready to fight and work, by God's truth, and by being true and truthful ourselves.
2.	Shoes of We can only fight it we have a firm footing. this is supplied by the Gospel.
3.	Sword of (which is Sacred Scripture) is our one offensive weapon. See how Christ, our Captain, used the sword of the Spirit when the devil tempted Him.
IV.	THE PURPOSE OF OUR ARMOR.
1.	To defend us against the assaults and temptations of the Evil One.
2.	So that we may be Christ's faithful Soldiers and Servants
3.	And stand ready for our Lord when He comes (just as soldiers put on their armor, and have it bright and clean as they watch for their general).
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
