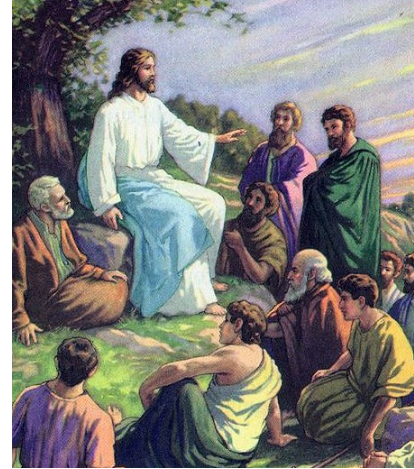

The following section, Matthew 5:2-12, is a well known passage containing a list commonly known as The Beatitudes. The word “beata” means happy in Latin, and this list of nine beatitudes gives us God’s “blueprint” for happiness. God’s blueprint for happiness is just about opposite what most people think will bring them happiness. Here is a list most people would agree with: money, conquest of nature and world, justice, easy life, in need of nothing, health and freedom from pain, sexual pleasure, success, self-esteem, fame, honor, and respect. Notice how different it is from God’s list. Because God is our Creator, we should trust His list.

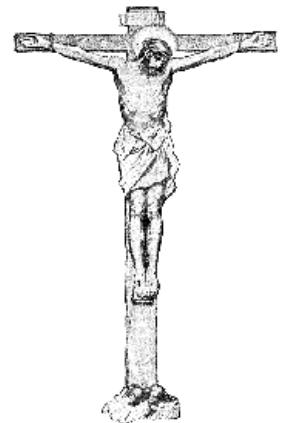

\*Jesus perfectly embodied the fulfillment of the Law (which is summa-  
rized later in Matthew: "*You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and

by his loving obedience to the Father and by being a willing sacrifice for  
us. His righteousness exceeded that of the Pharisees, who followed the  
rules but did not follow them out of love.
